Mixed fortunes for the German women: Sabrina Mockenhaupt crossed the line exhausted in 2:28:08 while Susanne Hahn finished in 2:28:49. "Mocki" lay on the ground and required medical attention. She'd hoped to improve her personal best and run around 2:24. Hahn was returning the marathon after having her first child. Both have run inside the German Olympic qualifying standard but are likely to feel very differently about their performance.

Rita Jeptoo of Kenya finished fifth in 2:25:44, again an unofficial time.

30.10.2011 12:29:34

Agnes Kiprof overtook Merima Mohammed in the closing stages to take second, maintaining her fine consistency in Frankfurt.

Mamitu Daska wins the women's title in an unofficial time of 2:21:57, a personal best for the Ethiopian by over two minutes.

30.10.2011 12:28:02

Agnes Kiprof finishes second in 2:23:52, a personal best. Flomena Chepchirchir 3rd on debut in 2:24:19. All times unofficial.

30.10.2011 12:25:39

Mamitu Daska wins the women's title in an unofficial time of 2:21:59, a personal best for the Ethiopian by over two minutes.

30.10.2011 12:23:57

Levy Matebo finished second in 2:03:15 with Albert Matebor third in 2:05:23. Wilson Kipsang was 2:03:42 in his wonderful performance for his second course record in succession but all times are unofficial.

30.10.2011 12:18:59

The Austrian record holder Guenther Weidlinger had a fine run with 2:12:23 for 23rd place. His federation's Olympic qualifying standard is 2:14, so he can look forward to London 2012.

30.10.2011 12:18:16

Philip Sanga was fourth in 2:06:07, Robert Cheruiyot fifth in 2:06:29 and Peter Kirui, the pacemaker who ran to the finish, sixth in 2:06:31. All times unofficial.

14 men finished under 2:10!

Levy Matebo finished second in 2:03:15 with Albert Matebor third in 2:05:23. Wilson Kipsang was 2:03:42 in his wonderful performance but all times are unofficial.

Kipsang just misses the World Record! What a run! Unofficially, he broke the tape in the Festhalle four seconds outside the WR.
